



# VEREDICTUM GENERAL TERMS OF USE

Effective Date: May 1, 2026

These General Terms of Use (the “**Terms**”) govern access to and use of the Veredictum digital dispute resolution platform, including any related websites, dashboards, accounts, case-management tools, communications, billing functions, and other services made available by Veredictum (collectively, the “**Platform**”).

These Terms are entered into between the person or entity using the Platform and **Veredictum, Inc.**, a Delaware corporation with registered address at 1111B S Governors Ave, #24864, Dover, DE 19904, United States, (“**Veredictum**,” “**we**,” “**us**,” or “**our**”).

By creating an account, accessing the Platform, using any Veredictum service, submitting or participating in a dispute, accepting an appointment as arbitrator, or otherwise using the Platform, you agree to be bound by these Terms.

## 1. Relationship Between These Terms and Veredictum Rules

- 1.1. These Terms govern the contractual, technical, account, access, billing, and platform-use relationship between Veredictum and users of the Platform.
- 1.2. Arbitration proceedings administered by Veredictum are governed by the applicable Veredictum arbitration rules, including, where applicable, the **Veredictum Commercial Arbitration Rules** and any other rules, schedules, procedural orders, or case-specific directions applicable to the relevant proceeding (the “**Rules**”).
- 1.3. If there is any conflict between these Terms and the applicable Rules in relation to the conduct, validity, administration, or procedural effect of an arbitration, the applicable Rules shall prevail.
- 1.4. These Terms do not create, expand, limit, or modify any arbitration agreement between parties, except as expressly provided in the applicable Rules or accepted through the Platform.

## 2. The Platform

- 2.1. Veredictum provides a digital platform for the administration and management of dispute resolution proceedings, including arbitration and, where available, mediation or other forms of alternative dispute resolution.
- 2.2. The Platform may allow users to create accounts, manage business profiles, submit disputes, upload documents, receive notices, track deadlines, communicate through designated channels, appoint or authorize representatives, make payments, access case materials, and participate in proceedings administered by Veredictum.



- 2.3. Veredictum may update, modify, suspend, replace, or discontinue any Platform feature at any time, provided that doing so does not impair the procedural integrity of an active proceeding in a manner inconsistent with the applicable Rules.
- 2.4. Veredictum may use automated systems and artificial intelligence within the Platform, including for case administration, document organization, procedural support, quality control, security, technical operation, and, where applicable under the Rules, decision-making functions.

### 3. Eligibility and User Categories

- 3.1. To use the Platform beyond public website access, you must create and maintain an approved registered account.
- 3.2. The Platform may include the following user categories:
  - a) **Business User**: an individual registered user who may create, administer, access, or act within a Business Account, subject to assigned permissions;
  - b) **Business Account**: an account associated with a company, organization, sole proprietorship, professional practice, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, or other business or professional activity;
  - c) **Lawyer / Legal Advisor**: an individual registered user authorized to act as legal counsel, legal advisor, representative, or similar advisor in relation to one or more specific matters; and
  - d) **Arbitrator**: an individual registered user who may be appointed, confirmed, and authorized to access and act in a specific proceeding in accordance with the applicable Rules.
- 3.3. Veredictum may add, rename, combine, or modify user categories, roles, or permission structures from time to time.
- 3.4. You may not use the Platform if you are prohibited from doing so under applicable law or if Veredictum has suspended or terminated your access.

### 4. Registration, Verification, and Account Approval

- 4.1. All information submitted to Veredictum or through the Platform must be true, accurate, complete, current, and not misleading.
- 4.2. Veredictum may require identity, business, professional, payment, authorization, conflict, compliance, or other verification information before approving, activating, maintaining, expanding, or restoring any account or role.
- 4.3. Registration does not create an automatic right of access. Veredictum may refuse, delay, suspend, limit, or revoke access where verification is incomplete, inaccurate, inconsistent, suspicious, non-compliant, or otherwise unacceptable to Veredictum.
- 4.4. You are responsible for keeping all account, contact, business, authorization, billing, and payment information accurate and up to date.
- 4.5. Veredictum may rely on the information provided through your account unless and until it is properly updated through the Platform.



## 5. Business Users and Business Accounts

- 5.1. A Business User may create or be granted access to one or more Business Accounts.
- 5.2. A Business Account represents the business, professional activity, organization, or entity in whose name proceedings may be initiated, managed, or funded and to which Veredictum may issue invoices or charges.
- 5.3. A Business Account may correspond to a corporation, limited liability company, partnership, sole proprietorship, professional practice, or other business or professional activity.
- 5.4. A Business Account must designate at least one administrator with authority to manage the account. Veredictum may refer to the principal administrator as the “**Super Admin**” or by any other platform designation.
- 5.5. The Super Admin may invite, authorize, restrict, or remove other Business Users and may assign role-based permissions, including permissions to view matters, create matters, upload documents, manage billing, authorize representatives, access notices, or perform other actions made available through the Platform.
- 5.6. Each Business Account is responsible for all actions taken by Business Users acting through or under that Business Account, except to the extent caused by Veredictum’s own unauthorized access or system failure.
- 5.7. Veredictum may treat actions taken through a Business Account by a properly authorized Business User as valid, authorized, and binding on the Business Account.

## 6. Business Groups

- 6.1. Veredictum may allow related Business Accounts to be organized under a shared “**Business Group**” or similar account structure.
- 6.2. A Business Group may be used to manage access, subscriptions, packs, billing arrangements, reporting, or other features across multiple related businesses, entities, professional practices, or business activities.
- 6.3. Unless expressly stated otherwise in the applicable subscription, pack, invoice, order form, or Platform description, each Business Account within a Business Group remains separate for case access, procedural status, filings, documents, notices, and dispute-specific permissions.
- 6.4. Veredictum may require proof of relationship, authorization, ownership, control, or other legitimate connection before allowing Business Accounts to be grouped or to share subscription or pack benefits.
- 6.5. Use of any pack, subscription, credit, benefit, or allowance by a Business Group is subject to the terms published on the Platform at the time of purchase or otherwise accepted by the relevant Business Account.



## **7. Lawyers and Legal Advisors**

- 7.1. A Lawyer / Legal Advisor may access or act in a matter only after being authorized through the Platform by the relevant Business Account or a duly authorized Business User and after accepting the assignment through the Platform.
- 7.2. Authorization of a Lawyer / Legal Advisor for one matter does not authorize that person for any other matter unless the Platform expressly provides for broader authorization and the relevant Business Account grants it.
- 7.3. Once a Lawyer / Legal Advisor has accepted authorization for a specific matter, procedural control of submissions and document uploads in that matter may be restricted to that Lawyer / Legal Advisor, and the relevant Business Users may be limited to viewing, monitoring, downloading, or otherwise accessing the matter as permitted by the Platform.
- 7.4. A Business Account or duly authorized Business User may revoke a Lawyer / Legal Advisor's authorization through the Platform, subject to any procedural consequences, timing limitations, or directions applicable under the Rules or in the relevant proceeding.
- 7.5. Veredictum does not verify, certify, or warrant that any Lawyer / Legal Advisor is admitted to practice law, licensed, regulated, insured, qualified, conflict-free, or authorized to provide legal services in any jurisdiction. Each Business Account is responsible for selecting and authorizing its own representatives.
- 7.6. Nothing in these Terms creates an attorney-client relationship between Veredictum and any user.

## **8. Arbitrators**

- 8.1. Arbitrators may access a proceeding only after being selected, appointed, confirmed, or otherwise authorized in accordance with the applicable Rules and Platform procedures.
- 8.2. An Arbitrator's access is limited to the specific proceedings for which access has been granted.
- 8.3. Arbitrators must provide complete and accurate information required by Veredictum, including information relating to identity, availability, independence, impartiality, conflicts, disclosures, credentials, tax, payment, and compliance matters.
- 8.4. Arbitrators must comply with the applicable Rules, any applicable code of conduct or appointment terms, confidentiality obligations, Platform instructions, and all case-specific procedural requirements.
- 8.5. Veredictum may suspend, limit, or revoke an Arbitrator's Platform access where required by the applicable Rules, by a conflict or disclosure issue, by security or compliance concerns, or by any failure to comply with Veredictum requirements.



## **9. Account Security and Credentials**

- 9.1. You are responsible for maintaining the confidentiality and security of your login credentials, devices, authentication methods, and account access.
- 9.2. You must not share your credentials or allow another person to use your account.
- 9.3. You must promptly notify Veredictum of any actual or suspected unauthorized access, credential compromise, security incident, or misuse of your account.
- 9.4. Veredictum may require multi-factor authentication or other security measures as a condition of access.
- 9.5. Veredictum may suspend or restrict access where it reasonably believes that an account has been compromised or is being misused.

## **10. Authorized Use of the Platform**

- 10.1. You must use the Platform only for lawful, authorized, and legitimate purposes connected with Veredictum services.
- 10.2. You must not:
  - a) submit false, misleading, fraudulent, unlawful, abusive, defamatory, or infringing content;
  - b) impersonate another person or misrepresent authority, identity, affiliation, authorization, or legal capacity;
  - c) interfere with the Platform's operation, security, integrity, or availability;
  - d) attempt to access accounts, matters, data, documents, systems, or functionality without authorization;
  - e) upload malware, harmful code, corrupted files, or content designed to disrupt or compromise systems;
  - f) scrape, reverse engineer, copy, resell, sublicense, or commercially exploit the Platform except as expressly permitted by Veredictum;
  - g) use the Platform to train, benchmark, develop, or improve competing systems without Veredictum's prior written consent;
  - h) evade technical limits, filing limits, access restrictions, payment requirements, verification processes, or procedural controls; or
  - i) use the Platform in a manner inconsistent with these Terms, the applicable Rules, or applicable law.
- 10.3. Veredictum may remove, block, quarantine, restrict, or refuse content or access where necessary for security, compliance, procedural integrity, or Platform operation.

## **11. Matters, Filings, Documents, and Procedural Actions**

- 11.1. Users may submit disputes, filings, documents, evidence, communications, and procedural actions only in the manner permitted by the Platform and the applicable Rules.
- 11.2. Each user is responsible for the accuracy, completeness, legality, relevance, format, and timely submission of the content that user uploads or submits.



- 11.3. The Platform may impose technical limits on file type, file size, number of documents, naming, format, structure, metadata, submission windows, or other filing requirements.
- 11.4. A submission is effective only when properly submitted through the Platform and accepted for filing in accordance with the applicable Rules and Platform procedures.
- 11.5. Drafts, incomplete uploads, failed submissions, unsubmitted materials, or materials blocked by the Platform do not constitute valid procedural submissions unless the applicable Rules or Veredictum expressly provide otherwise.
- 11.6. Veredictum may rely on timestamps, logs, audit records, access records, and submission records generated by the Platform.

## **12. Notices and Communications**

- 12.1. Users must maintain accurate and operational email addresses and contact details in the Platform.
- 12.2. Unless the applicable Rules provide otherwise, notices and communications may be sent through the Platform, by email, or by any other method made available or approved by Veredictum.
- 12.3. For proceedings administered under the Rules, notices, service, and computation of time shall be governed by the applicable Rules.
- 12.4. Platform alerts, dashboards, reminders, and status indicators are provided for convenience and case management. Users remain responsible for monitoring their accounts, email addresses, deadlines, and proceedings.
- 12.5. Veredictum is not responsible for a user's failure to receive, open, read, monitor, or act on a notice where the notice was validly sent in accordance with the applicable Rules or Platform procedures.

## **13. Fees, Payments, Packs, and Subscriptions**

- 13.1. Fees, charges, packs, subscriptions, credits, allowances, arbitrator fees, administrative fees, and other pricing terms are those published on the Platform or otherwise made available by Veredictum at the time of purchase, filing, renewal, or contracting.
- 13.2. By purchasing a pack, subscription, or service, initiating a proceeding, submitting a filing that requires payment, or authorizing paid use of the Platform, the relevant Business Account agrees to pay all applicable amounts.
- 13.3. Billing and payment methods shall be those made available by the Platform from time to time.
- 13.4. Veredictum may require advance payment, valid payment method registration, payment authorization, deposits, retainers, or other payment arrangements



before activating a proceeding, allowing a procedural act, granting access to paid functionality, or continuing service.

- 13.5. Unless expressly stated otherwise, prices exclude taxes, duties, bank fees, currency conversion charges, payment processor fees, or other third-party charges, which may be added or charged separately where applicable.
- 13.6. Veredictum may change its prices, packs, subscriptions, payment methods, billing procedures, and pricing structure prospectively. Changes do not affect already purchased services, active packs, or active subscriptions during their current term unless expressly stated and accepted or required by law.
- 13.7. Failure to pay may result in non-activation, suspension, restriction, loss of functionality, inability to submit procedural acts, termination of services, collection activity, or other consequences stated in these Terms, the applicable Rules, or the Platform.

#### **14. Business Account Responsibility for Charges**

- 14.1. The Business Account is responsible for all charges, fees, subscriptions, packs, proceeding costs, and other amounts incurred through that Business Account or by authorized Business Users.
- 14.2. Where a Business Group structure is used, the allocation of charges, pack benefits, subscription coverage, and payment responsibility shall be determined by the applicable Platform settings, order form, invoice, pricing terms, or accepted purchase terms.
- 14.3. Veredictum may issue invoices, receipts, payment confirmations, or billing records electronically.
- 14.4. Users must promptly review billing records and notify Veredictum of any billing dispute. Failure to do so within a reasonable period may limit the ability to challenge the charge, except where prohibited by law.

#### **15. Taxes**

- 15.1. Users are responsible for all taxes, levies, duties, assessments, or governmental charges arising from their use of the Platform, purchases, subscriptions, packs, proceedings, or payments, other than taxes based on Veredictum's net income.
- 15.2. Veredictum may collect and remit taxes where required or where it determines in good faith that collection is appropriate.
- 15.3. Users must provide accurate tax, billing, residency, business, exemption, and invoicing information where requested.

#### **16. Confidentiality and Access Control**

- 16.1. Veredictum is designed to support confidential dispute resolution proceedings.



- 16.2. Access to a matter is restricted to users authorized for that matter, the applicable decision-maker, Veredictum personnel, essential service providers, and any other persons permitted under the applicable Rules or by valid direction.
- 16.3. Users must not access, use, disclose, copy, distribute, download, export, or retain case materials except as authorized by the applicable Rules, Platform permissions, these Terms, or applicable law.
- 16.4. Users are responsible for maintaining the confidentiality of materials accessed through their accounts.
- 16.5. Veredictum may implement role-based permissions, access logs, technical controls, and other measures to protect confidentiality and procedural integrity.
- 16.6. Veredictum may disclose information where required by law, court order, regulatory obligation, enforcement process, sanctions screening, security investigation, or the applicable Rules.

## **17. Privacy and Data Processing**

- 17.1. Veredictum processes personal data and case-related data in accordance with its privacy notice, data-processing terms, and applicable law.
- 17.2. By using the Platform, users acknowledge that Veredictum may process account data, contact data, business data, payment data, usage data, technical data, case data, uploaded materials, communications, and other information necessary to provide, secure, administer, support, improve, and audit the Platform and Veredictum services.
- 17.3. Case data may be used for operation of the Platform, administration of proceedings, security, integrity, quality control, support, auditing, compliance, and functional improvement of the Platform.
- 17.4. Veredictum will not use case data to train, fine-tune, or materially improve substantive AI decision-making models unless the affected parties have provided express, specific, and separate consent, except where otherwise permitted by applicable law and consistent with the applicable Rules.
- 17.5. Additional details regarding data collection, retention, deletion, service providers, cross-border transfers, user rights, and security practices are set out in Veredictum's privacy notice or data terms.
- 17.6. Veredictum may use cookies and similar technologies in accordance with its Cookie Policy and any consent preferences made available through the Platform or website.

## **18. Platform Availability and Technical Operation**

- 18.1. Veredictum aims to provide reliable Platform access but does not guarantee uninterrupted, error-free, or delay-free availability.



- 18.2. The Platform may be unavailable or degraded due to maintenance, updates, security issues, network failures, third-party services, force majeure events, user-side failures, or circumstances beyond Veredictum's reasonable control.
- 18.3. Veredictum may conduct scheduled or emergency maintenance at any time.
- 18.4. Users are responsible for maintaining their own internet connection, devices, browsers, software, email access, cybersecurity controls, and technical ability to use the Platform.
- 18.5. Where a technical issue may affect an active proceeding, Veredictum may take reasonable administrative steps consistent with the applicable Rules to preserve procedural fairness and the integrity of the record.

## **19. Third-Party Services and Providers**

- 19.1. The Platform may rely on third-party providers for hosting, infrastructure, cybersecurity, identity verification, payments, email, document processing, transcription, analytics, support, or other services.
- 19.2. Veredictum is not responsible for third-party products or services that are not controlled by Veredictum, except to the extent required by law.
- 19.3. Payment processing may be handled by third-party payment processors. Use of payment methods may be subject to the terms and policies of those processors.
- 19.4. Veredictum may change third-party providers from time to time.

## **20. Intellectual Property**

- 20.1. Veredictum and its licensors own all rights, title, and interest in and to the Platform, including software, workflows, interfaces, designs, documentation, templates, systems, processes, trademarks, logos, service marks, content, and technology.
- 20.2. Subject to these Terms, Veredictum grants each authorized user a limited, revocable, non-exclusive, non-transferable, non-sublicensable right to access and use the Platform for authorized purposes.
- 20.3. Users retain ownership of materials they upload or submit, subject to the rights granted to Veredictum under these Terms and the applicable Rules.
- 20.4. Users grant Veredictum a worldwide, non-exclusive, royalty-free license to host, store, copy, process, transmit, display, analyze, organize, translate, convert, and otherwise use submitted materials solely as necessary to operate the Platform, administer proceedings, provide services, comply with applicable obligations, enforce these Terms, and exercise rights under the applicable Rules.
- 20.5. No rights are granted except as expressly stated in these Terms.



## **21. User Content and Responsibility**

- 21.1. Users are solely responsible for the content they upload, submit, authorize, transmit, or make available through the Platform.
- 21.2. Users represent that they have all rights, authority, permissions, and legal bases necessary to submit and use their content through the Platform.
- 21.3. Veredictum does not endorse, verify, guarantee, or assume responsibility for user-submitted content, evidence, legal arguments, factual statements, or documents.
- 21.4. Veredictum may preserve, restrict, disclose, or remove user content where required for legal, procedural, security, compliance, or operational reasons.

## **22. No Legal Advice**

- 22.1. Veredictum is a dispute resolution institution and technology platform. Veredictum does not provide legal advice, legal representation, tax advice, financial advice, or professional advice to any party.
- 22.2. Information, templates, prompts, summaries, automated outputs, platform guidance, help materials, or AI-generated content made available through the Platform are not legal advice and should not be relied upon as a substitute for advice from qualified professionals.
- 22.3. Users are responsible for obtaining independent legal or professional advice where appropriate.

## **23. AI Outputs and Platform Assistance**

- 23.1. The Platform may generate summaries, classifications, procedural prompts, document organization, draft text, internal records, or other automated outputs.
- 23.2. Unless the applicable Rules expressly provide otherwise, Platform-generated outputs are operational tools and do not replace party submissions, evidence, procedural orders, decisions, or awards.
- 23.3. Users are responsible for reviewing any content they submit, rely on, approve, or transmit through the Platform.
- 23.4. The role of AI in any arbitration shall be determined by the applicable Rules and the selected or applicable decision-maker modality.

## **24. Suspension, Restriction, and Termination**

- 24.1. Veredictum may suspend, restrict, or terminate access to the Platform, any account, any role, any Business Account, any Business Group feature, or any specific functionality if:
  - a) required for security, compliance, legal, regulatory, sanctions, fraud-prevention, or risk-management reasons;
  - b) the user provides false, incomplete, misleading, or unverifiable information;



- c) the user breaches these Terms, the applicable Rules, or Platform instructions;
  - d) payment is overdue, declined, reversed, disputed, or otherwise not completed;
  - e) account activity appears unauthorized, abusive, fraudulent, unlawful, or harmful;
  - f) continued access may compromise confidentiality, procedural integrity, system integrity, or other users; or
  - g) Veredictum otherwise has a reasonable basis to restrict access.
- 24.2. Suspension or termination of account access does not automatically terminate any arbitration agreement, proceeding, payment obligation, confidentiality obligation, or other obligation that by its nature should survive.
- 24.3. Where suspension or termination may affect an active proceeding, Veredictum may take steps consistent with the applicable Rules to preserve procedural fairness and the integrity of the proceeding.

## **25. Disclaimers**

- 25.1. The Platform and Veredictum services are provided on an “as is” and “as available” basis, except as expressly stated in these Terms or required by law.
- 25.2. To the maximum extent permitted by law, Veredictum disclaims all warranties, whether express, implied, statutory, or otherwise, including warranties of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, title, non-infringement, availability, accuracy, and error-free operation.
- 25.3. Veredictum does not warrant that the Platform will be uninterrupted, secure, error-free, free of harmful components, or compatible with every user system.
- 25.4. Veredictum does not guarantee any procedural, legal, commercial, financial, enforcement, settlement, or case outcome.

## **26. Limitation of Liability**

- 26.1. To the maximum extent permitted by law, Veredictum shall not be liable for indirect, incidental, special, consequential, exemplary, punitive, or enhanced damages, or for lost profits, lost revenue, lost business, loss of goodwill, loss of data, loss of opportunity, or business interruption, whether based on contract, tort, statute, strict liability, or any other theory.
- 26.2. To the maximum extent permitted by law, Veredictum’s aggregate liability arising out of or relating to these Terms, the Platform, or Veredictum services shall not exceed the amounts paid to Veredictum by the relevant Business Account for the specific service giving rise to the claim during the six (6) months preceding the event giving rise to liability.
- 26.3. Nothing in these Terms limits liability to the extent such limitation is prohibited by law.
- 26.4. The limitations in this Section apply regardless of whether a remedy fails of its essential purpose.



## **27. Indemnification**

- 27.1. To the maximum extent permitted by law, you agree to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Veredictum, its affiliates, officers, directors, employees, contractors, service providers, agents, and representatives from and against any claims, liabilities, damages, losses, costs, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or relating to:
- a) your use or misuse of the Platform;
  - b) your breach of these Terms or the applicable Rules;
  - c) content, documents, data, or materials you submit or authorize;
  - d) your violation of law or third-party rights;
  - e) unauthorized access caused by your failure to secure credentials or systems;  
or
  - f) your misrepresentation of identity, authority, capacity, affiliation, or authorization.
- 27.2. Veredictum may control the defense of any indemnified matter. You must cooperate reasonably with the defense and may not settle any matter in a way that imposes obligations on Veredictum without Veredictum's prior written consent.

## **28. Changes to These Terms**

- 28.1. Veredictum may update these Terms from time to time.
- 28.2. Updated Terms will be posted on the Platform or otherwise made available by Veredictum. The updated Terms will become effective on the date stated in the updated version.
- 28.3. Continued use of the Platform after updated Terms become effective constitutes acceptance of the updated Terms.
- 28.4. Changes to these Terms will not alter the procedural rules governing an already active arbitration except to the extent permitted by the applicable Rules, agreed by the parties, or required by law.

## **29. Governing Law for These Terms**

- 29.1. These Terms and any non-arbitral dispute arising out of or relating to these Terms or the Platform shall be governed by the laws of the State of Delaware, without regard to conflict-of-laws rules.
- 29.2. This Section does not alter the seat of arbitration, governing arbitration law, reference courts, or procedural framework applicable to any arbitration administered by Veredictum under the Rules.

## **30. Disputes With Veredictum**

- 30.1. Any dispute between a user and Veredictum arising out of or relating to these Terms, the Platform, an account, billing, access, or Veredictum services shall first be addressed through good-faith discussions with Veredictum.



- 30.2. If the dispute is not resolved informally, the parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the state or federal courts located in Delaware, unless Veredictum designates another forum in a separate written agreement or unless applicable law requires otherwise.
- 30.3. Nothing in this Section limits Veredictum's right to seek injunctive, equitable, protective, collection, or emergency relief in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 30.4. This Section does not govern arbitration proceedings between parties administered by Veredictum under the Rules.

### **31. Export Control, Sanctions, and Compliance**

- 31.1. You may not use the Platform in violation of applicable export control, sanctions, anti-corruption, anti-money laundering, anti-terrorism, or similar laws.
- 31.2. Veredictum may screen users, Business Accounts, payments, matters, and transactions for compliance purposes.
- 31.3. Veredictum may refuse, suspend, restrict, or terminate access where required or appropriate for sanctions, export control, anti-money laundering, fraud-prevention, or compliance reasons.

### **32. Force Majeure**

- 32.1.
